# Rules & Regulations



## EC RULES

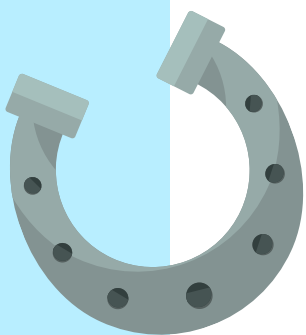
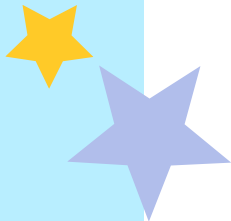
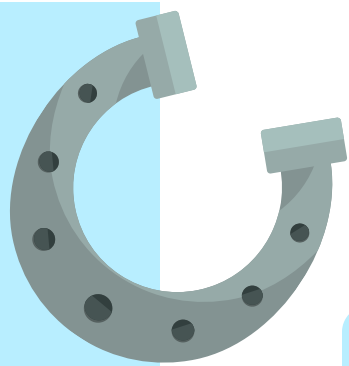
1. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.
2. All riders and Owners of horses or ponies entered in at this horse show require current Bronze or higher EQUESTRIAN CANADA Sport Licenses
3. Hors Concours riding will not be permitted at this horse show.
4. Back numbers must be worn and visible at all times while mounted on the show grounds.
5. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set be the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in the EC sanctioned competition to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.
6. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
7. All horses entered in any class at a competition must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
8. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments
9. Any rider(s) entering any class at this horse show, and any person/ group listed as the owner(s) in the EQUESTRIAN CANADA (EC) Competition Horse Recordings of any horse or pony entered in any class at this horse show, must be current members in good standing of Ontario Equestrian (OE) and must supply original or copy of their current membership card at the show. Exhibitors, Owners or Lessees, and individuals accepting legal responsibility for an entry must be current Equestrian Canada Sport License holders in good standing and must supply original or copy of their current Sport License with their entry form. Exhibitors, Owners or Lessees, and individuals accepting legal responsibility for an entry who do not hold a valid Sport License are permitted to participate with the purchase of a Temporary Sport License. (EC Gen. Regs, Chapter 2)

# Rules & Regulations



## REGULATIONS

1. Proper show attire, including jackets, is required for all classes, unless excused by show management. Formal attire is optional.
2. Protests must be made in writing and must be in the hands of the secretary within 48 hours of completion of the class concerned. No protest will be considered unless accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which shall be forfeited to the committee if said protest is not sustained. Protesting an animal's height carries a \$100 cash deposit. NOTE: Protests are to be made through the steward of the horse show.
3. After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring.
4. A rider will be eliminated after 2 refusals (3 in a Hunt & Go class).
5. Junior competitors must wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on competition grounds. Approved headgear meets the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) standards and displays the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British standard, BSI is also acceptable.
6. All entry forms must be signed by the competitor or Guardian for juniors. No competitor will be allowed to show without the required signature and will be liable for administration fees and/or scratch fees.
7. Code Of Conduct: Pertaining to the EC rules of conduct, is inappropriate to shout instructions or critique a rider as they are in competition. Providing guidance in a normal speaking voice when the rider is near the in-gate is acceptable.
8. Scratching classes may be done with the show office prior to the start of the class, and will incur a \$50 Scratch Fee
9. Management reserves the right to limit or close the entries of any classes/divisions.
10. Entries and applicable fees received on or before the closing date will receive a 20% discount on Stall, Entry & Schooling Fees. **CLOSING DATE for MAY SHOW: Sunday May 12th. CLOSING DATE for JULY SHOW: Sunday July 7th. CLOSING DATE for AUGUST SHOW: Sunday August 11th.** Entries received after this date will be charged full price.
11. Refunds: Administration and stall fees are not refundable, **No Exceptions.** Entry fees will be returned if cancelled by email 24 hours prior to the first class entered with proper medical documentation. There will be no refund for classes scratched after the class start.
12. No entries will be accepted without a Credit Card Authorization form completed or payment by cash or cheque. **Etransfers will also be accepted, using the password 'Pickering'.** No back numbers will be issued to any horse or rider for whom an entry has not been fully completed. All unpaid fees will be considered an outstanding account until paid in full. No entry will be accepted for exhibitors not in good standing.
13. Show Management reserves the right to change or amend show scheduling.
14. Stabling requests must be accompanied with an Entry through Horse Shows Online. Stabling fees are prepaid and non-refundable. Shavings must be ordered with Stabling requests.
15. All motorized vehicles may be operated by fully licensed drivers only. Vehicles will be impounded by the competition and also held liable if this rule is not enforced.
16. Vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. There is no parking on the roads or barn areas at all.
17. Horses must be bathed in wash rack areas only. These areas are for washing horses only.
18. All visiting dogs must be kept on a leash and all owners must abide by the "Poop & Scoop" law. Show Management reserves the right to request the removal of any dog that is a nuisance, disruptive or aggressive.
19. There is absolutely no grey water drainage allowed on the facility grounds.
20. Horses remaining on the property overnight must have an assigned stall. No horses are permitted to be kept in trailers or temporary corrals overnight.





## Equestrian Canada Statement of Principle

EQUESTRIAN CANADA, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA is committed to:

Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, is a primary consideration in all activities.

Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.

Ensuring that owner, trainer, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.

Providing for the continuous wellbeing of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.

Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.

Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.

Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.

Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

- **In 2024, coaches will need to have a Licensed Coach Status at all EC sanctioned competitions.**
- **In 2025, coaches will need to have a Licensed Coach Status and Certification at all EC sanctioned competitions.**

# PHC Derby Challenge Divisions



## CLASSES

The PHC Hunter Derby Challenge series provides an opportunity to showcase a horse/ponies boldness and athleticism over a challenging course set using 2 rings connected with a grass chute. Natural obstacles and interesting jumps will be used as well as traditional hunter jumps to create a course with handy options consisting of inside turns, unique approaches, broken lines and unrelated distances. In addition to the traditional qualities of smoothness, manners, jumping style and way of going, Judges will also reward handiness and brilliance. A course walk will take place for each derby.

**Judging:** Each round receives an open numerical score with 3 components up to a maximum of 120:

1. Hunter score (out of 100)
2. High Performance Bonus (up to 10 bonus points): 2 bonus points awarded for each of the 5 high performance options taken on course
3. Handy bonus (up to 10 bonus points): Up to 10 additional bonus points awarded at the judge's discretion for additional handiness

**Hunt & Go Format:** Consists of 2 phases, one classic hunter round and one handy hunter round jumped consecutively. The classic hunter round will consist of 7-8 fences with 3 high options. After completing the classic round horses will pass through a set of markers to begin the handy portion of the class. The handy hunter round will consist of 5-8 fences with 2 high options. Posted Order of Go.

### 2 Round Format:

Classic Round: The classic hunter round will consist of 9-10 fences with 3 high options

Handy Round: Top 10 scores after the Classic round will return in reverse order of score for the Handy round. The handy hunter round will consist of 5-8 fences with 2 high options. First and second round scores will be combined to create final standings. Posted Order of Go.

### 1. \$1,000 Low Derby

**Entry \$100**

**Fence Height: 2'0 with 2'0 Options.** Formal attire is encouraged. Open to horses and ponies and all riders. Lines will not be adjusted for ponies. May and July dates will be Hunt & Go format. August date will be a 2 round classic format.

### 2. \$1,500 Medium Derby

**Entry \$150**

**Fence Height: 2'6 with 2'9 Options.** Formal attire is encouraged. Open to horses and ponies and all riders. Lines will not be adjusted for ponies. May and July dates will be Hunt & Go format. August date will be a 2 round classic format.
